
### **ABOUT THE TEXT**

While you work on mastering practical English skills that you will use every day, you will share in the real lives of interesting people – people like you or your classmates – whose lives have been enriched through reading, writing, and learning. The photographs and the stories feature Canadians who are pursuing their personal, academic, and career goals through the acquisition and improvement of English writing skills.

The photo shoots were a great way for students in different programs to meet and work together on something that will be useful to you and your peers at colleges and universities across Canada. The pictures and stories add a human dimension to the subject of grammar, making it interesting...and fun!

This text provides a full treatment of the essential English skills that you need to know in an accessible way. Parts Two through Six begin with a list of objectives that will assist you in identifying the skills that you can expect to have acquired by the end of the unit. A diagnostic pre-test will identify the skills with which you may be familiar and those skills that require more attention. Every chapter presents the need-to-know information on the first page followed by activities that reinforce what you learn. Each chapter concludes with a series of tests to help you track your progress. You will be learning through doing – the most effective way to learn.

## PART ONE: Becoming a Better Writer

The first part of this text presents the writing process in a brief, clear, and easy-to-understand manner. The information covered in this section includes:

- The basic goals of writing
- Paragraph and essay structure
- The importance of supporting your points
- Different patterns of organizing your support
- The writing process, from prewriting to formatting and proofreading
- Topics for writing paragraphs and/or essays

#### **PART TWO: The Basics**

This section introduces you to some basic grammar skills, including:

- Recognizing the various parts of speech and types of sentences
- Working with subjects and verbs
- Using the correct pronoun form, article, and modifier (adjective or adverb)

### **PART THREE: Beyond the Basics**

Once you have mastered some of the basics, it's time to move on to the next level of essential skills. These include:

- Making verbs agree with their subjects
- Avoiding common sentence errors such as fragments, run-ons, comma splices, misplaced and dangling modifiers, and faulty parallelism

#### **PART FOUR: Punctuation**

Now it's time to introduce some rules for using punctuation marks such as:

- Apostrophes
- Quotation marks
- Commas
- Colons and semicolons

# **PART FIVE: Mechanics and Spelling**

This final section covers some important but often-overlooked skills, such as:

- Improving spelling
- Correctly using frequently misused words
- Learning when to capitalize words
- Correctly using numbers and abbreviations

# **PART SIX: Proofreading**

An important part of becoming a good writer is learning to proofread—to check the next-to-final draft of a paper for grammar, punctuation, and other mistakes carefully. This chapter provides you with some hints for improving your proofreading skills, as well as ten proofreading tests with which to practise those skills.

### FOR THE INSTRUCTOR

"What's the catch?" you might be asking. "What are people's photographs doing in this textbook? And just how will they help me teach *English Essentials: What You Need to Know about Grammar, Punctuation, and Usage?*"

The student photographs are just one of the number of features that distinguish this book from other grammar texts on the market:

- 1. Personal photos and stories. All too often, grammar texts are dry, dull affairs, about as interesting as a study of rock dust on the planet Mars. As educators, we sometimes felt we were leading our students on a death march when we moved them through a traditional grammar text. So we have added a strong human dimension to this text by illustrating the grammar skills with photos and stories of interesting people from all walks of life. The stories describe not only their personal lives but also their involvement with reading and writing. Some of these people are pictured on the cover of the text.
- **2. Ease of use.** All of the following make the textbook easy for students to understand and use:
  - The essentials are presented in a highly accessible way. Look at any of the one-page reviews that open each of the skill chapters in Part Two. Only the basics of each skill are presented on this page, which students can read and understand quickly. Once they grasp this basic material, they go on to learn more and then practise applying the skill. It is better to learn a step at a time than to risk confusion by trying to learn everything at once.
  - The chapters are self-contained, so that students focus on a particular skill set.
  - Explanations are written in simple, clear language, with a minimum of grammatical terminology.
  - An inviting two-colour design with headings and other graphic elements make the content accessible.
  - Finally, the book is written in a friendly and helpful tone a voice that never condescends to students, but treats them as adults.
- **3. Abundant practice.** Students learn best when clear explanations are followed by multiple opportunities to practise which this text includes.
- **4. Engaging materials.** In addition to the photos and true stories, lively and engaging examples and practice exercises will maintain student interest throughout the book.

- 5. Inclusiveness. A combined forty years of teaching experience taught that applying the skills in actual writing situations helps students master them. Part One focuses on how to become a better writer and the writing process. Part Two presents basic information about grammar and also covers topics not addressed in Part One. Parts Three, Four and Five go beyond the basics and deal with areas that some other grammar texts neglect: spelling improvements, parts of speech, and subject-verb agreement. Part Six offers guidance and practice in the crucial skill of proofreading. Within the covers of *English Essentials* are all the basic writing materials that instructors and students need.
