# 1.5 CHOOSING A BODY COPY FONT

Most designers believe that serif type is most appropriate for use as text. The tiny strokes, serifs, allow the reader to connect the letters into words and the words into lines for fast reading. However, choosing a font for use as body copy shouldn't be as simple as using the default font, most often Times, or randomly picking a serif font.
