The student's concept map is excellent and completely and thoughtfully organizes and connects the concepts. There are more levels to the concept hierarchy than in a good concept map, and there are some especially insightful cross-links. The student has been very clear about which parts of the concept map represent his/her new learning. The map is very easy to follow and is neat and presentable.	
The student selects an appropriate set of concept words to include in the concept map. These concept words are arranged in a hierarchy from most general to most specific. There are several levels of this hierarchy. There are cross-links between concept words in different parts of the hierarchy. The student has indicated which parts of the concept map represent his/her new learning. The map is easy to follow and is neat and presentable.	
The student uses some concept words inappropriately. Some important concept words are missing in the map. The hierarchy of the list of concept words has only a few levels.
