






2. An example of an acronym are IM. That stands for "instant message." Most people who uses instant messages for any length of time has seen an acronym.

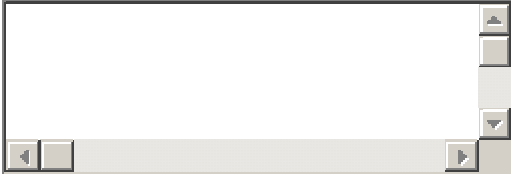
3. Another acronym is BRB. Many people uses BRB to stand for "be right back."

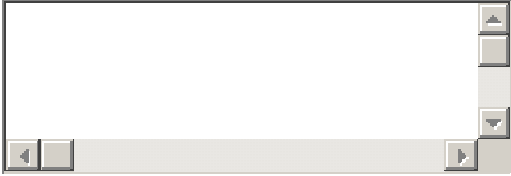
4. One that show a reaction to something is LOL. Almost everybody say that stands for "laugh out loud."
