Blame the immigrants.

Since the EU was expanded in 2004 immigration into the UK from Eastern European countries has increased markedly. Even supermarkets now cater for Poles, Lithuanians, Latvians and Slovakians. At the same time this group of workers has been blamed for everything that has beset the UK and many things which haven't. Here are a few:

"A British worker earning £30,000 per annum has suffered a reduction in earnings of around £230 per annum because of the fear of unemployment." Is this fear due to competition from immigrants, competition from international companies, or technology such as computers or robots?
