WHY DO MY SCREENS LOOK DIFFERENT?

The screens shown in the textbook may differ from what you see. Each time you sign on, QuickBooks Online is the most current version. As versions are updated, screens may differ. The screen changes are usually minor and do not affect the features and functions of the software.

Compatible browsers for tablet/mobile devices:

You can access QuickBooks Online with Android, or a Windows 8 device. Some QuickBooks features are available only when viewed from computers (Windows or Mac). Other features may not work as expected.

For best results on your mobile device when using a browser, use the following:

iPhone / iPad

- iOS 6.1 or newer.
- Safari browser (recommended)
- Other browsers such as Chrome, Atomic, and Dolphin are not supported on iOS

Android smartphones and tablets

- Jelly Bean 4.2.2 or newer
- Chrome browser (recommended)
- Other browsers such as Firefox, Opera, and Dolphin are not supported, but may work

Surface / Windows 8

- Internet Explorer 10 (recommended)
- Windows Phone 8 is not supported and will not work

INTERNET EXPLORER

Intuit does not currently support QuickBooks Online in a 64-bit version of Internet Explorer. QBO is only supported in the 32-bit version of Internet Explorer. (Hint: Intuit is the company that publishes QuickBooks products, http://quickbooks.intuit.com/online/).

To read the Microsoft knowledgebase article, How to determine whether a computer is running a 32-bit version or 64-bit version of the Windows operating system, go to http://support.microsoft.com/kb/827218.

The 64-bit versions of Windows XP, Windows Vista, Windows 7 and Windows 8 provide a 32-bit version of Internet Explorer in the list of programs. This version is the one that must be started. There are actually *two* shortcuts for Internet Explorer:

- Internet Explorer
- Internet Explorer (64-bit)

To access the correct version:

- Press the Windows logo key + R to access the Run command. The Windows logo key is usually between the Ctrl and Alt keys on the keyboard.
- 2. In the **Open** field, enter **iexplore**.
- 3. Click OK.

QUICKBOOKS WINDOWS APP

To download the Windows app, go online to http://quickbooks.intuit.com/blog/the-quickbooks-windows-app-is-here/. The information includes:

- 1. Open QBO with one click.
- Stay signed in.
- 3. Load pages faster.
- 4. Easily open multiple windows.
- 5. Work faster with keyboard shortcuts.

ENABLING COOKIES

If you start your browser, and a window appears that says "You must enable cookies in order to continue," do this:

Firefox 3.x for Windows

- 1. Choose Tools > Options > Privacy.
- 2. Select the Accept cookies from sites checkbox.
- 3. Click <OK>.

Internet Explorer 6.x/7.x/8.x for Windows

- 1. Choose Tools > Internet Options > Privacy > Advanced.
- 2. If Override automatic cookie handling is selected, make sure Always allow session cookies is also selected.
- 3. Click <OK>.

Safari 3.x/4.x for Mac

- 1. Choose Safari > Preferences > Security.
- 2. In the Accept cookies section, click Always.
- 3. Close the Security window.

After enabling cookies, choose View > Refresh/Reload to refresh your browser.

COMMON QUESTIONS

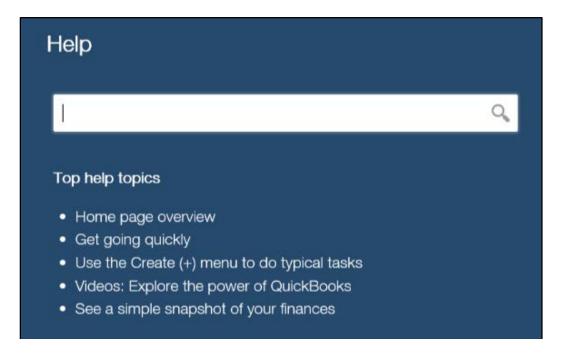
- Exporting report data to Excel requires Excel 97 or later.
- Internet Explorer 8 and Safari 5: Intuit will be phasing out support for these browsers around summer 2013. Please upgrade to a newer browser.
- Intuit does not currently support the Linux operating system. If you
 choose to use QBO with Linux anyway, Intuit recommends using it
 with Chrome or the latest version of Firefox.
- Intuit does not support the 64 bit version of Internet Explorer. If you
 have a Windows 7 64 bit system, you need to use QBO in the 32 bit
 version of IE.
- Intuit does not have any hard-and-fast systems requirements per se.
 If you can run one of the recommended browsers on your system,
 then your system should be fine for QBO. Check with Google
 (Chrome), Mozilla (Firefox), Microsoft (IE) or Apple (Safari) for system
 requirements for each browser.

QUICKBOOKS ONLINE HELP

Within QBO, you can select and type in a question or phrase. The top help topics are:

- Home page overview
- Get going quickly
- Use the Create (+) menu to do typical tasks
- Videos: Explore the power of QuickBooks
- See a simple snapshot of your finances.

Go to the Help information and explore the top help topics. Experiment. Type a question, word or phrase.



QUICKBOOKS ONLINE SUPPORT

To get help while signed in to your company, click the Help link at the top right which will load the QuickBooks Online Support page. If you are not signed in to your QBO company, you can access support by going https://support.gbo.intuit.com.

On this page, questions are answered 24/7.

HOME PAGE DOES NOT SHOW EXPENSES OR PROFIT AND LOSS

Since your system date (current date) and the day/year you are recording transactions is probably different than what is shown, Expense and Profit and Loss graphs are not shown. To see the Expenses balances and the P&L amounts, click on the down arrow and select This year —



For Expenses, link to the THIS YEAR amount shown to go to the Transaction Report. Change the From and To dates to reflect the appropriate month.

For Profit and Loss, link to the THIS YEAR amount shown to go to the Profit and Loss statement. Change the From and To dates.

Observe there may be a 1/2 down arrow icon are two pages. Click on the down arrow to see more accounts and their balances.

JOURNAL REPORT AND TRANSACTION REPORT DIFFERENT

How can I resolve differences between what the Journal report shows and the Transaction Detail by Account or Transaction Detail by Date report?

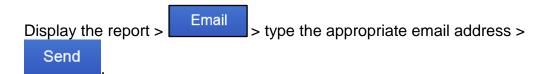
The Journal report will <u>not</u> show non-posted entries. For example, if you are creating a new entry for a Vendor and Purchase Order is selected,

the Transaction reports will show the non-posted PO but not the Journal. This can be changed with Customize.

HOW MANY USERS CAN BE SIGNED IN?

You can have multiple users logged in at the same time. If those users are on the same item or transaction, and make an edit, the last change made is saved. When you sign in, any changes made will be there. To learn more about users, go to https://support.gbo.intuit.com. Do a search for Number of users allowed. A related search is Manage users and their access. Using the Help feature, you can also search from within your QBO company.

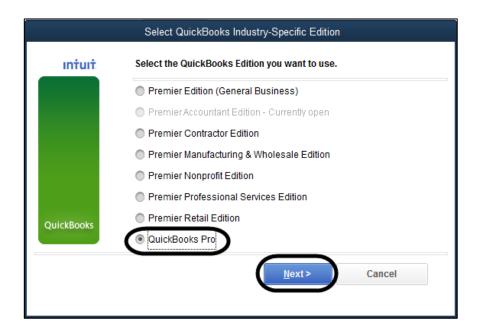


TOGGLE QUICKBOOKS DESKTOP TO ANOTHER EDITION

The student trial version software, included with the textbook, can be used on one computer for 140 days.

Before following these steps, check with your instructor for his or her preference. The software site license purchased by the school and the 140-day CD included with the textbook are the same software version.

1. From the menu bar, select File; Toggle to Another Edition. The Select QuickBooks Industry-Specific Edition window appears. Select QuickBooks Pro.



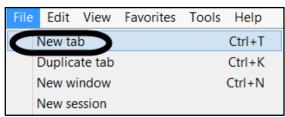
2. Click and the version of QuickBooks changes to the Pro.

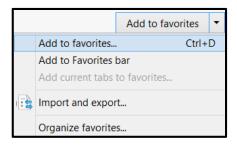

- 2. Click > select the down-arrow next to Add to Favorites.



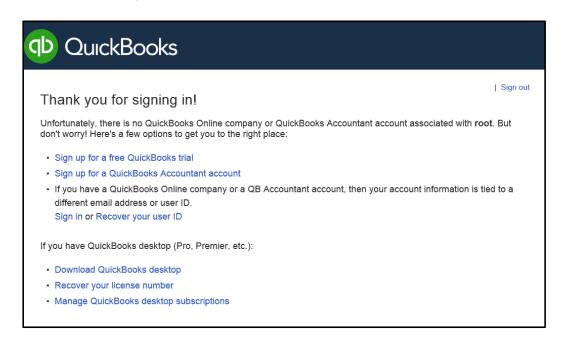
3. Make a selection from the list; for example Add to favorites bar.

REPORT ISSUES

If this message appears, "Something went wrong. We are working on it," then this screen, refer to the workarounds below.



When using the test-drive or Cloud Ware, here are a couple workarounds.

- 1. Click on the browser's back arrow. If you are trying to go to the Profit and Loss report, use the Company Snapshot instead (Reports > Recommended Reports > Company Snapshot > link to Profit and Loss).
- 2. If you are trying to go to the Account List or Chart of Accounts, use the Settings menu: Gear > Chart of Accounts > Run Report.
- 3. When working on Cloud_Ware, go to Gear > QuickBooks Labs > then toggle to Redesigned Reports "ON." Refer to Chapter 11's Customizing Reports section, pages 421-422.
