| Key Term             | Definition   | Page Number |

| Endnote              | A note at the end of the document or section that is used to cite references or to give more information.  | 120         |
| Footer               | Text that appears at the bottom (foot) of every page.  | 112         |
| Footnote             | A note at the bottom of the page used to cite references or give more information.   | 121         |
| Full Screen view     | A view that displays a document with all of the Word toolbars, task panes, and other screen items removed.   | 130         |
| Go To                | Navigation tool that lets you move through a document in a specified way.<br>You can, for example, go to items such as pages, sections, or headings, or<br>move up or down a specific number of lines in the text. | 128         |
| Header               | Text that appears at the top of every page.  | 112         |
| Navigate             | To move through your document to a particular location.  | 113         |
| Outline View         | The view of a document that displays the text, indented to show the heading level.   | 132         |
| Page break           | The place where one printed page ends and the next begins. A soft page break is when Word automatically moves text to a new page. A hard page break is a break inserted by the user to force text to a new page.   | 117         |
| Reading Layout view  | The view of a document that maximizes the viewing area for reading.  | 130         |
| Report               | A formal document used to communicate information.   | 109         |
| Section              | A portion of a document that can have different formatting from the rest of the document.  | 123         |
| Section break        | A break that you insert to start a new section.  | 123         |
| Select Browse Object | A button that lets you choose how to move through a document. You can, for example, browse by page, section, heading, footnote, or endnote.  | 128         |
| Table of contents    | A list of the topics in a document, along with their page numbers.   | 124         |
| White space          | The space between the margins and the edge of the page.  | 114         |
| Word Count           | The command that counts the number of words, characters, and paragraphs in a document or selection of text.  | 116         |
| Zoom                 | To view a document at a larger or smaller size.  | 115         |
