Button	A graphic item that can be clicked to perform a specific task.	518
Cursor	A blinking mark that indicates where the text you key will appear on the screen. Also known as an insertion point.	527
Dialog box	A box that is used to enter specific information to perform a particular task such as naming and saving a document.	521
Folder	An item that helps the user organize files.	521
Insertion point	A blinking mark that indicates where the text you key will appear on the screen. Also known as a cursor.	527
Key	To type text.	527
Menu	A list of related commands.	518
Menu bar	A bar that displays the names of available menus.	517
Menu command	An individual option on a menu.	518
Outline pane	The pane that displays the outline view, or text, of the presentation.	523
Pointer	The arrow used to select on-screen items, such as menus and buttons.	517
ScreenTip	The description of an object such as a button that appears when you point to the object.	518
Scroll bar	A bar at the right side or bottom of the screen that allows you to move up and down or left and right in a document.	525
Slide icon	In the Outline pane, the small slide image that is located next to the slide content. Click the image to move among slides.	523
Slide pane	The part of the PowerPoint screen where you key in text.	527
Slide Sorter View	View you can use to add more slides, to delete slides, or to rearrange the order of slides.	524
Slides pane	The pane that displays miniatures of the slides in a presentation.	523
Status bar	The bar at the bottom of the screen that displays information such as the current slide number and the total number of slides in the presentation.	517
Task pane	An optional part of the PowerPoint screen that provides easy access to common tasks.	519
Title bar	The bar at the top of the screen that displays the name of the current presentation.	517
Toolbar	The bar that contains buttons that can be clicked to perform different tasks.	518
